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One of the most sobering questions I ask myself is Am I reproducing Christ-like behaviors in the men that I am discipling with God's Word?

Jesus Christ said, "Either make the tree good, and his fruit good; or else make the tree corrupt, and his fruit corrupt: for the tree is known by [his] fruit." Matthew 12:33 KJV

Examples of bearing fruit:

- After studying the notes from the Henry Morris Study Bible two guys told me of their conversations with in-laws and associates about evolution and the Bible. They said they felt equipped to dialogue intelligently with them.
- After involvement in our study, two men decided to become involved in negotiations with school unions about their accountability with spending public funds.
- After studying the articles in the Founders' Bible together, along with the Scriptures, men are initiating conversations based on this knowledge.
- One friend said that these studies are so informative that he has started teaching these truths with another group of men.
- Men are learning to be the spiritual leaders of their homes by leading discussions with their wives around the Word of God, protecting and empowering their kids to be salt and light in this convoluted culture, and taking time to build Truth into their lives.



Organic Home Church

The New Testament church primarily met daily from house to house. Act 5:42 NLT, "And every day, in the Temple courts and from house to house, they continued to teach and preach this message: 'Jesus is the Messiah.'"

God's original educational plan is found in Deuteronomy 6:4-7, "Hear, O Israel: The Lord our God [is] one Lord: and you shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, and with all your soul, and with all your might. And these words, which I command you this day, shall be in your heart: And you shall teach them diligently to your children, and shall talk of them when you sit in your house, and when you walk by the way, and when you lie down, and when you rise up."

We have outsourced our Christianity so extensively to the local church that we think it is normal and that our pastors and youth pastors are to be the primary teachers of our kids. If you would ask the average family how much effort they put into teaching their children from the Word of God, or spontaneously talk about the Lord and what He is doing, most would say they seldom if ever do. Actually the most organic expression of the local church is the family opening up the Word of God with Dad and Mom leading the discussion. Here are some of the ways we have done this.

• Each person has his or her own Bible and opens to the particular passage, with a fine-point pen in hand to underline. Some read the text out loud and all comment on what they have learned or have observed. I cannot tell you what a thrill it is for me to hear our grandchildren read the Bible aloud and make comments.

- We have shown short videos from ICR.org called *That's A Fact* about various scientific subjects like the wonder of God creating our hands based on Psalm 139:14 and Isaiah 41:10. We viewed how the Ice Age took place after the Great Flood, and in the video scientists talked about *aerosols* which are particles released from volcanoes. One of our grandsons said, "We just learned about aerosols in science this week!"
- We showed a video about the rise of civilizations and languages based on Genesis 4 and 10. This led us to a two-week study of the powerful 17th chapter of Acts when Paul addressed the Athenians how God placed each of us where we live so we might best find Him.
- Each of us, including adults, draw pictures of what the Lord has shown us in the Bible study and discussion and then stand up and present our drawings. I save all of the pictures with their names and dates.
- Each person prays at times. When was the last time you prayed out loud publicly at church service on a Sunday with your family or with others? You can do church in your PJs, without make up, being dressed up or being cleaned shaven! Gear your Bible study portion to apply to the ages of your children and their interests.

I would suggest you give it a try with your immediate family. Perhaps a few relatives and friends could be invited and make it a monthly gathering. You will be amazed at what everyone learns and retains. The personal connection with your kids will probably be the most powerful long-term benefit in the years to come.
